## 1. Chairman's Call to Order, Welcome and Opening Remarks

Steve Woelfel, Director of Strategic Planning, Office of Transportation Planning, Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT), Representing Jamey Tesler, Acting Massachusetts Secretary of Transportation and Chief Executive Officer, called the November 23, 2021 meeting of the Pioneer Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to order at 10:01 a.m. Mr. Woelfel then asked for a roll call from the MPO members present as follows: Paula Simmons, MassDOT District Two, Representing Massachusetts Department of Transportation Highway Division Administrator Jonathan Gulliver; Rick Sullivan, President and CEO, Economic Development Council of Western Massachusetts; William Reichelt, Mayor of West Springfield; David Narkewicz, Mayor of Northampton; Nicole LaChapelle, Mayor of Easthampton; Roger Fuller, Selectboard Member, Town of Chesterfield; James Barry, Belchertown Selectboard Member; Joshua Garcia, Mayor of Holyoke; Walter Gunn, Chairman, Pioneer Valley Planning Commission; and Sandra Sheehan, Administrator, Pioneer Valley Transit Authority (PVTA). PVPC Principal Planner Dana Roscoe confirmed that this roll call constitutes a guorum.

Following the roll call, Mr. Woelfel moved to take up the minutes of the previous MPO meeting held on October 26, 2021.

2. MPO Approval of Minutes of the Previous Meeting of the Pioneer Valley MPO Held Remotely on October 26, 2021

Mr. Woelfel called for a motion to approve the minutes of the previous Pioneer Valley MPO meeting which was held on October 26, 2021.

MOVED BY DAVID NARKEWICZ, MAYOR, CITY OF NORTHAMPTON, SECONDED BY RICHARD SULLIVAN, PRESIDENT AND CEO, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OF WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS, TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 26, 2021 PIONEER VALLEY MPO MEETING AS PRESENTED.

Mr. Woelfel requested a roll call and each of the MPO members in attendance responded affirmatively with the exception of two abstentions: Walter Gunn and Mayor Joshua Garcia

THERE BEING NO FURTHER COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS, THE MOTION WAS APPROVED BY THE MPO MEMBERS PRESENT.

3. Review, Discussion and MPO Approval to Release Proposed FFY 2022 Transit Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments for the Required 21 day review period

PVPC Senior Transportation Planner Andy McCaul explained that since the last MPO meeting, the Pioneer Valley Transit Authority (PVTA) applied for a 5339 Low No Grant to purchase eight low or no emissions, battery powered buses to replace eight diesel powered buses: four 40 ft. electric buses for \$4,400,000 and four 35 ft. electric buses along with additional funding for workforce technical development and programming. Mr. McCaul asked the MPO members to release the FFY 2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Program with the addition of this proposed amendment for the purchase as explained and as funded by the 5339 Low No Grant for a required 21-day public review period.

Mr. Woelfel requested a roll call and each of the MPO members in attendance responded affirmatively.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS, THE MOTION WAS APPROVED BY THE MPO MEMBERS PRESENT.

4. Review, Discussion and MPO Approval to Release Proposed Changes to the Transportation Evaluation Criteria (TEC) for the Required 21 Day Review Period

PVPC Senior Transportation Planner Andy McCaul explained that at the October MPO meeting, it was determined that there were some changes that needed to be made to the Transportation Evaluation Criteria (TEC). Mr. McCaul then proceeded to delineate those changes: add MEPA information and an expected advertisement date to the cover page; update the Congestion Management Process (CMP) definitions; update definitions for targeted development sites; remove a .5 point, Comprehensive Economic Development point and increase Priority Development Area points from .5 to one point; remove Health Impact Assessment and replace it with Sensitive Receptors; and update definitions to include the Regional Safety Compass and bicycle and pedestrian amenities.

Mr. McCaul asked the MPO members to release these proposed changes to the Transportation Evaluation Criteria (TEC) for the required 21 day review period.

MOVED BY WALTER GUNN, CHAIRMAN, PIONEER VALLEY PLANNING COMMISSION, SECONDED BY RICHARD SULLIVAN, PRESIDENT AND CEO, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OF WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS, TO APPROVE THE RELEASE OF THE PROPOSED CHANGES AS PRESENTED TO THE TRANSPORTATION EVALUATION CRITERIA (TEC) FOR THE REQUIRED 21 DAY REVIEW PERIOD

Mr. Woelfel requested a roll call and each of the MPO members in attendance responded affirmatively.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS, THE MOTION WAS APPROVED BY THE MPO MEMBERS PRESENT.

5. Review, Discussion and MPO Approval of Changes that the FHWA is Requesting for the MOU Governing the MPO Member and Alternate Seats on the MPO

PVPC Senior Transportation Planner Andy reported that each year a list of every TIP project awarded that fiscal year has to be posted to the PVPC website. He explained that there hasn't been a defined guidance regarding this requirement until now upon the request from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Mr. McCaul stated that the FHWA has requested that following proposed text be added to Section VI(B) of the Pioneer Valley MPO's Memorandum of Understanding (MOU):

The MPO, in cooperation with the State and public transportation operators, shall be responsible for the development of financial plans that support the long-range transportation plans and transportation improvement programs, and development of the annual listing of obligated (awarded) projects in accordance with CFR 450.314(a) provisions. This cooperation shall include the sharing of data included in the Regional Transit Authority's Transit Asset Management (TAM) plans and Public Transportation Agency Safety Plans (PTASP).

Mr. McCaul asked the MPO members to approve of these changes that the FHWA is requesting to be made to the MOU governing the MPO.

Mr. Woelfel requested a roll call and each of the MPO members in attendance responded affirmatively.

Mr. Woelfel thanked Mr. Frieri and Mr. Amaral for their updates and he then moved on to the next agenda item.

# 8. <u>Updates from Pioneer Valley Transit Authority (PVTA) Administrator Sandra Sheehan on Relevant Transit Issues</u> and Projects of Interest to the Pioneer Valley MPO Members

PVTA Administrator Sandra Sheehan reported that PVTA ridership has improved significantly with the latest figures showing ridership in September 2021 exceeded September 2020 ridership by 83%. Ms. Sheehan reported that the PVTA is working with PVPC staff to plan routes and make temporary service adjustments in order to continue to provide safe and reliable services. She added that on November 1<sup>st</sup>, adjustments were made to the Northampton base route and adjustments will be made to the Springfield base route on December 12<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Sheehan further reported that the PVTA has taken delivery of six new electric buses plus eight new electric buses from New Flyer. She reported that steps are being taken in order to accommodate charging these buses, and the PVTA's fleet of electric buses will be increasing next year by eight buses.

#### 9. Other Business

Mr. Woelfel announced that the next virtual MPO meeting is scheduled for December 28, 2021. There being no other business, Mr. Woelfel called for a motion to adjourn the meeting.
