Likewise, the Pioneer Valley Region MPO complies with the Governor's Executive Order 526, section 4, which requires that all programs, activities, and services provided, performed, licensed, chartered, funded, regulated, or contracted for by the state shall be conducted without unlawful discrimination based on race, color, age, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, creed, ancestry, national origin, disability, veteran's status (including Vietnam-era veterans), or background.

BICYCLING IN THE PIONEER VALLEY

In 2024, the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission (PVPC) partnered again with various public and private organizations to encourage bicycling in the Pioneer Valley. In collaboration with municipalities, advocacy groups, and businesses, PVPC promoted public awareness and advocated for policies and programs that encourage bicycling.

BIKE MONTH OVERVIEW

INTRODUCTION

PVPC has been raising awareness about the importance of bicycling through working with local coordinators to organize a month full of bike related events in Hampden and Hampshire counties. The effort aims at galvanizing the energy of local government officials, promoting events in various media outlets, recruiting citizen volunteers, and encouraging the participation of local businesses.

Events for Bay State Bike Month 2024 were held from Saturday, April 27th to Saturday, May 31st. This is the 25th year that the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission has coordinated this initiative in the Pioneer Valley region.

During the past several years, MassBike has taken a lead role in organizing a statewide initiative among biking groups across the state of Massachusetts. MassBike maintains a dedicated <u>website</u> page for Bike Month and encourages event hosts to list their event happenings throughout the state there. The website offers interested folks a one-stop shop to locate

nearby bike events. MassBike also promotes a Bike to Work Week during the dates designated by the American League of Cyclists, which has been the impetus for past Bike Commute Week events in the Pioneer Valley and Massachusetts.

This year, MassBike introduced a virtual Bike Month Bingo activity to encourage participants to expand their bike adventures and find some bike joy with friends. Participants would complete a Bike Month Bingo card by doing various types of bike related activities then posting their accomplishment on social media to encourage others to do the same. This would then allow the participant to enter a raffle draw for a Bay State Bike Month prize pack of useful items to cyclists of all levels such as a t-shirt, a buff, socks, and a bike lock.

PVPC staff created a poster listing local bike events in the Pioneer Valley Region during Bay State Bike Month 2024 and posted it on the PVPC's agency website. Upon request, PVPC staff printed color copies of the poster and dropped them off to various local partners to help spread the word out and assist in advertising the various events happening throughout the valley. This year's events included the popular bike breakfast hosted by a few partners in the region during Bike Month featuring sponsorships by local food businesses. Again, there were a couple of selfguided activities to allow people to take part at their own pace and comfort level.

EVENTS AND HOST COMMUNITIES

Planning for Bay State Bike Month began at the end of March 2024. At the first planning committee meeting, there were three attendees from a couple of organizations in addition to the two PVPC staff members. From there on, the committee continued to hold a weekly virtual meeting to support event planning. While not many more joined subsequent meetings, several of repeat participants were very skilled, well organized, and able to develop a series of bike month events for their own community without need for consultation. Local MassBike staff were regularly present at planning meetings. They were instrumental in keeping the group appraised of new events being posted to their bike-friendly virtual calendar of events hosted by the MassBike website. Several trail advocacy agencies and bike clubs joined the efforts of the statewide annual Bike Month held in May. Some bike partners synchronized their efforts with dates posted by the League of American Bicyclists who designated May 13th to the 19th of 2024 as Bike to Work Week.

Bike Month events aim to encourage residents of the Pioneer Valley to get on their bikes or join by foot and replace car trips with green, active modes of transportation that promote good health and reduce the emission of greenhouse gases by motorized vehicles. Two of the popular bike events are Mayoral rides and bike breakfasts. In addition, the Great Tree Bicycle Tour which offered both a guided group activity as well as a self-paced option reportedly received an even higher number of participants. Such annual events have been effective in engaging community members of all ages and abilities. This year, one of community trail cleanup events drew many participants that represented several organizations who collaborated in celebration of earth day and helped their communities gear up for bike month.

About 21 events were held during the 2024 Bay State Bike Month in the Pioneer Valley. The second artistic themed activity is the Springfield Annual Mural Ride, which visits larger than life-scale images featuring the history of the city and representing the diverse heritage of its inhabitants. These initiatives encourage mobility independence using transportation alternatives to the single occupancy vehicle. Various educational events during this month equip people with skills and knowledge that encourage them to commute by bike and introduce familiarity with bike transport to make biking part of their regular travel.

PARTICIPATION

There was good participation in new Bike Month activities and the expected attendance at recurrent popular annual events. Participants displayed a wide range of riding levels and motivations for riding bicycles. This shows the continued success of initiatives that raise awareness about the importance of bicycling in the Pioneer Valley. It also demonstrates the need for ongoing and sustained funding for bicycle infrastructure, improvements to trails, safety education, and bicycling activities in the Pioneer Valley.

Bay State Bike Month 2024 Survey Invite Posted to MassBike Facebook Page

This section of the report provides a summary of responses received from Pioneer Valley residents who filled out the Bike Month Survey that was posted online by MassBike. A total of 12 out of the 102 statewide responses came from Pioneer Valley residents, representing almost 12% of responses. This is twice the amount received a year ago, which indicates an improvement in engagement of the public to provide input and feedback about Bike Month efforts.

Of these responses, 75% were from Hampshire County residents and 25% from Hampden County residents. Most respondents indicated that they attended a bike month event, and one hosted an event. A quarter of them participated in the Bike Month Bingo, which indicates that they took part in four or more bike related activities during this month. Respondents came from various parts of the region, representing 8 different communities.

Half of the respondents indicated that Bike Month encouraged them to ride their bicycles more. A third indicated that it encouraged them to ride their bike for transportation. There was a good representation of all age groups from 25-74. Half of them were 55 or older. Slightly more than half were men. Only one was a person of color while the rest identified themselves as white.

The following are excerpts from responses to three of the open-ended questions.

- 1) What was your favorite part of Bay State Bike Month?
 - Engaging others with WalkBike Springfield to help with activities & participate
 - That it increases awareness and hopefully encourages more riding for all the reasons bikes are great for.
 - The idea that biking can be a permanent reliable form of transportation year-round.
 - I only learned about it today, so I guess learning about it at all! And the inspiration it gave me to take my bike out of the basement?
 - A good nudge to make sure the whole family is getting out and biking.
 - People
 - The Great Tree Bike Tour in Northampton. It was a great day for a ride and a beautiful route.
 - The repair event and special guided rides
 - Breakfast
 - Bike valet at the Springfield pancake breakfast
 - Building enthusiasm for biking
 - Finding out how many other people are passionate about biking.

- 2) What can we do to make Bay State Bike Month better in 2025?
 - Have a Springfield Mayor's (or at least public officials) ride
 - Introduce the idea of BIKE FOR THE REST OF YOUR LIFE, ALL YEAR. It is a dream, but I believe it is a good one.
 - Hm, maybe increased advertising in bike-friendly cities? (I'm in wmass so, Northampton). Idk if you do events to teach people to repair or maintain bikes /do least cost or free clinics but that may increase awareness?
 - More nudges to contact politicians for better bike infrastructure. It could be bike year every year if we treated bikes as transport that needs its own infrastructure.
 - Include link to ALL events in emails.
 - Reach out to more major employers to help them encourage their employees to participate. Run. Do a limited run of the E-bike rebate program?
 - During bike week, I found myself wishing that events were more spread out so that I could attend more.
 - A cookout ride
 - Partner with local schools, businesses, libraries, and organizations in each Town.
 - Hold more events in Western Mass.
- 3) What additional feedback do you have about Bay State Bike Month?
 - Will be doing the Bike Valet for the Pancake Breakfast again
 - Unrelated, but I LOVE the new 4' law and the road signs! Kudos for your part getting that passed into law!
 - Keep doing the fine work you are doing. We will get there.
 - I'm not sure if the Hadley asparagus fest counts as a bike friendly event And I know it's not in the month of May anyway but I only found out about you because of the fest's website- and couldn't find any info about what "bike valet-ing" is (maybe I didn't dig deep enough?) or the event itself on your website/instagram but teaching people about that could be useful!
 - Thank you!
 - Thanks for all your work organizing this event to promote bicycling.
 - It's fantastic! I already ride my bike as my primary way to get around town, but it was great to see so much bicycle enthusiasm.
 - It was great
 - Keep growing the initiative!
 - Let's get together for legislative action.

FUTURE GOALS

PVPC staff worked with Bike Month organizers and the Pioneer Valley Bicycle and Pedestrian Sub-Committee to establish the following goals for future events to celebrate the annual Bike Month.

- Continue to encourage hosting of family friendly events as an opportunity to educate and promote the next generation of riders.
- Use educational graphics that focus on health benefits to all ages, while promoting a multimodal transportation network to offer alternative transportation choices within the pioneer valley.
- Work with the PVPC Bike/Ped Committee to identify new communities to engage in future Bike Week Events for next year.
- Promote better attendance by grouping Cities that could work together, while identifying routes that make connections to and from each.
- Work with MassBike to develop and promote new events for next year.
- Use "Constant Contact" tool to notify participants about recurring bike month planning meetings to provide an opportunity for event hosts to collaborate on creating larger events. Fewer but larger events could be more attractive to participants.
- Create a database of contacts of partner organizations and individuals and parties interested in bike month.
- Consider holding a few in-person event planning meetings either at the offices of the PVPC or offer to join local meetings of partner organizations to encourage participation of new organizations.
- Research options for age-friendly participation in Bike Month Planning to remove potential technical barriers. Reach out to the aging friendly community to assess interest in participating in the planning of events.
- During the planning stage, remind participating event hosts to include groups of people with disabilities in their outreach efforts.
- Offer family friendly bike rides throughout the region. The monthly recurrence of the Northampton Bike Party is an effective way to build community. Building on critical mass rides nationwide, the local initiative has turned into a social gathering including some treats at the completion of a casual group ride down the main street of a community.
- Increase efforts in social media coverage to promote Bike Month events.
- Work with communities to help them promote their events.
- Continue to work on improving the ability to promote events. Use flyers and mail out postcards, as well as send out advertisements on local radio.

- Address the issue of the current text heavy poster due to the doubling of number of event offerings. This happened after the change in offerings from a week-long to a month-long worth of events. The use of a graphic with a QR code pointing to a detailed schedule of events could be a more effective way of communicating information about Bike Month.
- Offer communities the opportunity to create their own sub-regional poster. This would allow for the creation of lists of fewer events close to where the poster is being hung. An example would be to group Easthampton, Holyoke and Northampton events in one poster.
- Another idea is to color code events or group them by town/city to easily identify event locations in a busy poster or print the poster on larger size paper than the current 11" x 14'.
- Increase organization and coordination around the information being presented and other potential activities during the bike breakfast events. Work more with the local bike shops for this event.
- Conduct outreach events for the new 2025 Bike Plan Update. Offer public engagement activities to seek recommendations regarding routes, issues, policies.
- Have bikeshare representation at bike month events.
- Promptly reach out to Bike Week Event Organizers to get estimates of attendance at the conclusion of Bike Month.
- Connect with the college and university population to get interested student clubs and individuals involved before finals' week, when their end of semester activities usually conclude during the first week of May.
- Seek better media coverage to announce happenings before events.







May is #BikeMonth, and to celebrate #MassDOT held a groundbreaking for the new #Westfield River Levee Multi-Use Trail in the City of Westfield - Government.

This 2 mile-long multi-use trail will be located along the Westfield River levee, beginning at Franklin Avenue and extending to Williams Riding Way near Meadow Street. The project will include the construction and installation of retaining walls, bicycle rail, bicycle racks, park benches, trash receptacles, landscaping decorative bollards, and will connect neighborhoods in the region building on the completion of the Columbia Greenway Trail.

This Multi-use trail will be completed by Fall of 2025.


