

Summary of Proposed Changes to the FFY 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) – January 2025

HIGHWAY

- Add S13164 Springfield: FY24 EPA Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicles (CHDV) Grant: Achieving Annual Replacement/Deployment Parity: City of Springfield, Springfield Public Schools - 25 school buses for a total cost of \$10,153,296
- Add S13190 for \$1,500,000. Massachusetts – Longmeadow Passive Crossing Improvement Project (Up to \$1,200,000) Massachusetts Department of Transportation The proposed project was selected for Project Planning and Project Development and includes activities to support grade crossing-related improvements in Longmeadow on Amtrak-owned infrastructure. The project aligns with the selection criteria by improving safety and the mobility of people and goods, as the project will reduce the potential of incidents at a rural crossing that is heavily utilized by pedestrians and located on a nature trail. The project will also improve the efficiency of Amtrak’s New Haven to Springfield, Vermonter, and Hartford passenger rail lines. The Massachusetts Department of Transportation and Amtrak will contribute the 20 percent non-Federal match. This project qualifies for the statutory set-aside for projects in Rural Areas and \$144,000 of this project funding amount qualifies for the statutory set-aside for Planning projects.

The **2024 Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicles Grant Program** provides up to \$932 million in competitive grant funding to replace existing non-zero-emission heavy-duty vehicles with zero-emission vehicles, support zero-emission vehicle infrastructure, and to train and develop workers. The program will support the adoption and deployment of eligible Class 6 and 7 zero-emission vehicles while also funding zero-emission vehicle fueling infrastructure and workforce development and training. At least \$400 million of the available funding will be made available for projects serving one or more communities located in areas designated as being in non-attainment with the National Ambient Air Quality Standards.
